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Highlights

Introducing the **Eskaton Academy**

Eskaton launched the Eskaton Academy in June 2023, supported by grants from the California Department of Aging. The Eskaton Academy is an in-person and online, core-competency training program designed for all Eskaton staff. Central themes of the training program include hard and soft skills needed to be effective at supporting the changing needs of older adults.

The program also focuses on service standards that are central to Eskaton's shift towards a more hospitality-centered model. The program has even improved team member retention, with Academy participants being more likely to remain with Eskaton versus team members who did not participate.





Update on Standalone Skilled Nursing Locations

In September of 2023 Eskaton divested three stand-alone skilled nursing communities, Eskaton Care Center Manzanita, Eskaton Care Center Fair Oaks and Eskaton Care Center Greenhaven to a real estate investor with local operations provided by Cypress Healthcare. The sale marked a significant shift for Eskaton as we transition away from single site health care entities and into a primary focus on enhancing and expanding our residential living services.

Refreshed Mission, Vision and Values

Eskaton has begun a transformation from a health-centric model to a holistic social, wellness and hospitality model. As our goals as an organization evolve we have refreshed our Mission, Vision and Values to support this direction. Update on Eskaton Cameron Park

In 2023 Eskaton Cameron Park was closed, as the size and footprint of the building no longer fit within the standards of the rest of our Residential Living portfolio. In November and December of 2023, a total of 27 Eskaton Cameron Park residents relocated, with most choosing to move to other Eskaton communities in the area.

In April of 2024, Eskaton partnered with CAL FIRE to transform the building into the new Ponderosa Fire Center. The center is now the home of seven CAL FIRE Firefighter Hand Crews, accommodating more than 150 firefighters and support staff.



Spectrum of Services

Eskaton's diverse spectrum of services includes independent and assisted living, memory care, skilled nursing and rehabilitation. Our home-based services provide non-medical support for older adults in the comfort of their own homes. For older adults on limited incomes, Eskaton also offers affordable housing options.



Life Plan Communities and Multi-Level Communities offer a wide range of services on one campus, which may include independent living with services, assisted living, memory care, rehabilitation, skilled nursing care and short-term (respite) stays.



Independent Living delivers an independent lifestyle bolstered by the conveniences and confidence of available support.



Assisted Living provides residents with enhanced, personalized assistance with activities of daily living (ADLs) in the comfort of their apartment home.



Memory Care and Pre-Memory Care neighborhoods provide an environment supportive of self-expression, empowerment, and mutual respect through a transformative approach to care.

Affordable Housing

For older adults with limited incomes, rental assistance is available through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) at Eskaton's affordable living apartment communities.





Home-Based Services

Live Well at Home offers non-medical home-based services, including personal care, transitions to home, education and dementia care through our team of care navigators and professional caregivers.



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Community Outreach

Eskaton's Resource Navigation and "Friendship Line" (in partnership with Institute on Aging) are community programs in which trained employees and volunteers provide daily, cost-free check-in calls and assist older adults in identifying and navigating resources and services.
