

## **Eskaton Kids Connection**

Eskaton's award-winning Kids Connection partners Eskaton communities with elementary schools to create intergenerational friendships. Since 2009 this program has grown to include 31 classrooms, 30 Eskaton communities and has more than 1,000 intergenerational buddies each year. Eskaton Kids Connection earned the "Inspire Award" from the Twin Rivers Unified School District, was recognized for excellence by The Eisner Foundation, and was awarded the Innovations in Quality award by California Assisted Living Association.

Research\* shows that when generations come together, there are clear, positive outcomes for everyone involved. Older adults experienced:

- Fewer falls
- Increased strength and stability
- Increased mental acuity

Children experienced improved academic performance and enhanced social skills. Other benefits include increased mutual respect and sensitivity.

Structured activities at communities range from art projects, reading and interviewing to singing and eating lunch together. Classrooms also video chat with their buddies when not on site.
