

Stepping up to serve during COVID

Over the last nine months, the world has been profoundly impacted by the COVID pandemic. At Eskaton, we joined together with our healthcare partners to serve some of the most vulnerable residents of the greater Sacramento region.

In March of 2020, Eskaton opened a specialty wing at Eskaton Care Center Fair Oaks to care for those inflicted with COVID-19. To date, our incredible "Healthcare Heroes" have rehabilitated over 80 individuals who required specialized healthcare for a wide range of COVID-related symptoms, most of whom have been fully rehabilitated and were able to return home.

Eskaton-owned and managed communities have strict infection control protocols and wellness programs in place to ensure the health and well-being of our residents. The dedication and professionalism of all our care partners and team members is greatly valued and appreciated.

Eskaton was the proud presenting sponsor of the Alzheimer's Association's 2020 "Walk to End Alzheimer's," a fundraiser to finance much-needed research and support for individuals living with cognitive change. Over the last 10 years, Eskaton has raised nearly **\$140,000** for the organization, with team members and residents walking in solidarity with the Alzheimer's Association each year.

Across the organization, Eskaton had 13 teams and more than 330 employees, residents and family members participate in this year's virtual Walk. These individuals rose an unbelievable **\$28,043** through their combined fundraising efforts, which included socially-distanced car washes, bake sales, art auctions, raffles, and "dinners-to-go."

We are proud and overjoyed to be the recipient of the coveted "Senior Care Cup" for a second year in a row, awarded to each year's top fundraiser. We thoroughly



believe in the Association's mission to raise awareness of Alzheimer's in order to debunk myths and stereotypes associated with this and other forms of cognitive change.



With the help of the community, we were able to provide meaningful connections to support and sustain our seniors during these times of social isolation through three virtual volunteer opportunities: the gift of friendly telephone conversation via Eskaton's Telephone Reassurance Program, sending residents personal letters of love and encouragement, and the delivery of activity bags to help keep them entertained.

Over the last few months, Eskaton has distributed over 2,000 beautiful letters and cards, and more than 500 gift bags from caring individuals throughout our region. The diversity of their backgrounds, ages and experience not only enriched our program, but has inspired us with confidence that the power of generosity remains strong throughout Eskaton and the communities we serve.

Expanding services to those most in need

In the summer of 2020, Eskaton joint-ventured with InnovAge and Adventist Health to bring a new 37,000 square foot PACE Center to North Sacramento. This InnovAge PACE (Program for All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly) Center delivers access to a dynamic wrap-around program providing clinical, therapeutic, social and medical support to older adults who are living on limited incomes and at-risk for institutionalized care. An alternative to nursing facilities, participants can obtain geriatrician and clinic services, dental services, adult day healthcare, social engagement, nutrition services, transportation and more.

Meet Charlotte, an Eskaton affordable housing resident who recently enrolled at InnovAge PACE Center. "The PACE Center is exactly the bridge I needed to stay independent and living in my own home. I'm so happy I made the decision to join," Charlotte says.
