Guide to Home Healthcare

Home Healthcare and **Home Care** are distinct types of care which are both provided in a home setting, but most people aren't aware of the differences and use these terms interchangeably. The key difference is that **Home Healthcare is medical** care and **Home Care is non-medical** care. (See reverse side for chart that highlights some of the differences between these often confused services.)

Home Healthcare is a 100% covered Medicare benefit Home Care is private pay (out of pocket)

ABOUT HOME HEALTHCARE:

Home Healthcare is medical care provided by a physical therapist, nurse, occupational therapist, speech therapist or other skilled medical professional, and requires a written order from a physician. This type of care helps people recover at home and transition back to independence from a serious health issue such as an illness, surgery, hospitalization, rehabilitation, or a stay at a skilled nursing facility.

HOME HEALTHCARE SERVICES INCLUDE:

Skilled Nursing: Including wound care, diabetic care, pain management, care management of chronic diseases or conditions, support with physical cognitive decline, and more.

Physical Therapy: Including fall prevention, exercises to ensure safety, balance training, gait training, range of motion exercises, transfers and body mechanics training, establishing a home exercise program, and more.

Occupational Therapy: Including training to perform activities of daily living with adaptive devices, therapeutic activities to restore physical functions, muscle re-education, fine motor coordination, and more.

Speech Therapy: Language disorders that result in communication problems, diagnosis and treatment for swallowing problems, and more.

Medical Social Worker Services: Including counsel for long-range planning and decision-making, community resources awareness and planning, financial resources, and more.

REQUIREMENTS THAT MUST BE MET TO QUALIFY FOR HOME HEALTHCARE:

1. Home Healthcare must be ordered and overseen by a physician.

- 2. The person must be seen by a physician for the condition requiring Home Healthcare.
- 3. The person must be "confined to home", meaning that leaving the home to receive care is unsafe, requires the assistance of another (includes verbal cueing), or a device (cane, walker, wheelchair), and/or requires a taxing effort to leave the home compared to their normal ability.
- 4. The care needed must be "medical" rather than "non-medical".
